The Central Zionist Archives, Jerusalem, hold a small quantity of material on the local Zionist organization, which I have not yet seen, and Mr. Lucien Harris, Jerusalem, has one minute-book of the Oxford University Zionist Society.

This book was in a fairly advanced stage when Dr. C.M. Woolgar, Head of Special Collections at the Hartley Library, University of Southampton, drew my attention to relevant material there collected by Cecil Roth (AJA 151/3). I gratefully acknowledge the courtesy of the Library in making it available to me. It consists of:

- (i) two copies of the second half of a historical address given on the Centenary of the Congregation in 1941. The first half became the article in *Oxoniensia* 15, 1950, 63-80, and the typescript of the second half was under revision as late as 1950. Various errors and omissions are attributable to the fact that neither the Censuses nor the index to the *Jewish Chronicle* were available to him;
- (ii) a collection of miscellaneous notes, mostly connected with individuals and virtually all from published sources.
